CHANGES TO THE FAFSA

On Sept. 14, 2015, President
Obama announced significant
changes to the *Free Applica- tion for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA®)* process that will
impact millions of students.
Starting next year, students
will be able to do the following:

Submit a FAFSA[®] Earlier:

Students will be able to file a 2017–18 FAFSA as early as Oct. 1, 2016, rather than beginning on Jan. 1, 2017. The earlier submission date will be a permanent change, enabling

students to complete and submit a FAFSA as early as October 1 every year. (There is NO CHANGE to the 2016–17 schedule, when the FAFSA will become available January 1 as in previous years.)

What is the ICAP?

An ICAP—previously referred to as the Personal Education Plan (PEP)—is a personalized plan through which students define their post-secondary and career goals. Denver Public Schools (DPS) ECE-12th grade students participate in counselor-led guidance curriculum in order to develop a plan to prepare them for high school, college, and workforce readiness. The ICAP provides a framework that allows students to see the relevance of school to their future college and career aspirations. Students' ICAPs are always evolving as students recognize and build new connections between school and the world of work.

ICAP for Parents
